Dubai, United Arab Emirates:

As one of the world's fastest growing cities, Dubai has emerged as a premier luxury travel destination, drawing visitors from all over the globe. Cochin, India:

One of the finest natural harbors on the Arabian coast of India, Kochi (also known as Cochin) was once known as the center of the Indian spice trade. Goa's historical atmosphere, shaped by a fascinating mix of Portuguese and Indian influences, is unique. The Portuguese were here for some 500 years, and their presence can still be felt in customs like the siesta the easygoing Goans take every afternoon. Sossegade!



Bombay (Mumbai), India:

You can find everything from vibrant street scenes and the country's best nightlife, to an abundance of shopping. The city serves as both the financial and entertainment capital of India, so you are just as likely to see a famous "Bollywood" movie star as you are a high-powered businessman. With all there is to see and do, you will discover that Mumbai truly lives up to its billing as the "City of Dreams."

Muscat, Oman:

As one of the Middle East's oldest cities - dating back to the 2nd century AD, it's hard to believe that Muscat has been open to tourists for only a few decades, but seeing is believing! From the beautifully manicured parks and long, unspoiled stretches of beach to the stone moat that still surrounds the area, it is clear that Oman's monarchy has worked hard to protect the rich history and small, safe neighborhood feel of its capital city



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Things You Don't Want to Miss:

Dubai: For a sampling of some of Dubai's greatest treasures, be sure to visit the coastal town of Jumeirah during your stay. Here you'll find one of the world's finest hotels - as indicated by its elusive seven-star rating, as well as the beautiful Jumeirah Mosque - one of the few mosques open to non-Muslims for tours. After a day of exploring, take in the breathtaking scenery over a bite to eat on the beach.

Cichin: Drive out of Cochin city, pass through one of the India's most beautiful and serene landscapes to the district of Alappuzha. Here you can explore the Kerala backwaters as you take a motor boat ride through the waterways lined with dense tropical vegetation, and observe rural Kerala lifestyles that you would never see from the road.

New Mangalore: For a true cultural experience, the elaborate, night-long, dance-drama performance of the Yakshagana is something that simply cannot be missed while visiting Mangalore. Beginning at the twilight hours with the beating of drums, the Yakshagana consists of music, dance, and dialog portraying a story. The actors are adorned in beautifully vibrant costumes, headdresses and face paint, which they apply themselves.

Goa (Mormugao): Strong Portuguese influences make Goa unique in India, and many major monuments are within walking distance of each other, making this part of Goa's history easy to explore. The Arch of the Viceroys, built in 1597, commemorates the arrival in Goa of Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama. St. Catherine's Cathedral, which took 80 years to build, is said to be larger than any church in Portugal itself. And if you're drawn to miracles, the Church and Convent of St. Monica Christon is home to an image of the crucified Christ which is said to have spoken and opened its eyes.

Bombay (Mumbai): An architectural marvel, the Taj Mahal Palace and Towers, in its highly desirable waterfront location, provides breathtaking views of the Arabian Sea. Built in 1903, the hotel offers a unique blend of Indian class and Western style. An extraordinary example of luxury and elegance, the Taj Mahal Palace has hosted royalty, heads of state, business tycoons, celebrities, and hopefully soon, you!

When in Dubai:

- Enjoy a sail boat ride to The Palm, a tree-shaped island that has been reclaimed from the sea. Once The Palm Island are completed, they will add 120 kilometers of sandy beaches to Dubai and be visible from the moon. The Palm Island is built in the shape of 17 huge fronds surrounded by 12 kilometers of protective barrier reefs called a crescent.
- Visit the landmark of modern Dubai, the Burj Al Arab hotel. A monument worthy of the new millennium, this world-famous hotel stands on a man-made island linked by a bridge to the mainland. Upon arrival, guests proceed to a private room for high tea, a British tradition dating back to the 1840s.
- The Dune Dinner Safari is a great opportunity to explore the desert in just a few short hours. Experience the thrill of driving up and down golden yellow sand dunes in the comfort of our four-wheel drive vehicles. A sumptuous Arabian style BBQ of various succulent fresh meats and salads will be served.

Not only is Dubai home to world-class golf courses and beautiful beaches - unusual activities like desert safaris and sand skiing are also among its available adventures. If you're looking for a unique spectator sport, check out Camel Racing, one of Dubai's major pastimes. Then afterward you can fuel up with a freshly cooked campfire breakfast. It's no wonder Dubai is becoming known as an exotic playground for world travelers!

A general guideline regarding the games and limits on most cruises is as follows:

Texas hold'em: \$2-\$4, \$4-\$8, \$10-\$20, \$20-\$40

Omaha/8: \$4-\$8, \$10-\$20, occasionally higher

Mixed games: \$20-\$40, occasionally higher

No-limit hold'em at blinds of \$1-\$3 and \$2-\$5 with capped buy-ins

All poker games are open to anyone 18 years and older.
